

KOWHAI (Sophora chathamica)

Sub Canopy 8m



Description:

- Found near the coast from North Cape down as far as the Coromandel in the east and Kawhia in the west.
- Leaflets have short stalks and often overlap near the base.
- S. chathamica can hybridise with S. microphylla which as its name suggests has smaller leaves

Fruit & Flowers:

- Kowhai is Maori for yellow
- Full of nectar the flowers appear in the spring and are pollinated by birds. A favourite of tuis and bell birds.
- The fruit are brown segmented pods with one seed per segment.
- The seed itself is hard and waxy. It can float, however to encourage germination gardeners often need to nick the seed coat

Pests / Diseases:

• There is a moth whose caterpillar will eat leaves but not to the detriment of the tree
